# CHECKLIST FOR CASES ENDING WITH NO CONVICTIONS (KRS 431.076)

All charges that were disposed of without a conviction can be expunded unless the dismissal was part of a plea deal involving a plea to another charge (However, these charges can be expunded when, and if, the other conviction in the plea deal is expunded).

### **OTHER CRITERIA - Time periods**

If the disposition was an acquittal after a trial by a jury or by a judge

The petition must be filed 60 days afterwards And There are no further pending proceedings

### If the disposition was a dismissed with prejudice

The petition must be filed 60 days afterwards And The dismissal was not in exchange for a guilty plea to another offense And There are no further pending proceedings

#### If the charge was a felony and dismissed without prejudice

The petition must be filed 3 years afterwards And The dismissal was not in exchange for a guilty plea to another offense. And There are no further pending proceedings

#### If the charge was a misdemeanor and dismissed without prejudice

The petition must be filed 1 year afterwards And The dismissal was not in exchange for a guilty plea to another offense. And There are no further pending proceedings If the charge was referred to the Grand Jury with no indictment being issued

The petition must be filed 6 months afterwards And There are no further pending proceedings

Note: The prosecution has a period of time after the petition for expungement is filed (which could be as long as 180 days) in which it can move forward and submit the case to the grand jury.

The case was disposed of by some other means (for example, deferred prosecution)

Some judges and prosecutors may treat these dismissals as a dismissal with prejudice after the time for imposing a punishment has expired. However, it is quite possible you may have to return to court to get a formal order of dismissal. If you do this make sure the order is labeled *nunc pro tunc*, that it is effective as of the date you fulfilled the condition. Otherwise the waiting period could start from the later date.

# Please Note:

After July 14, 2020,

Charges (other than traffic infractions not otherwise classified as a misdemeanor) that end

in an acquittal or in a dismissal with prejudice where 1) all the charges in the case were also dismissed with prejudice and 2) this was not done in exchange for a guilty plea in another case will be automatically dismissed after 30 days without any action by you; however, you can

object and prevent such a dismissal if you wish.
